CAMP COLES TRIP

WHAT:

Coles Trip, the established camp of the Fairfax County Girl Scout Council, is a 229 acre site 40 miles south of the District of Columbia; it is located about 4½ miles from Route 1 in Stafford, Virginia.

To reach camp, follow Route 1 to the Stafford Court House, turn left at the blinker light, and follow the signs to Camp Coles Trip.

All wearing apparel and equipment should be labelled with the camper's name.

Baggage should be limited to one blanket roll or sleeping bag and one suitcase. Storage space is limited.

FEE:

Fairfax County Girl Scouts	\$45.00 per two-week session
Other Girl Scouts	\$55.00 per two-week session

REGISTRATION:

Prospective campers will register on Monday, April 16, 6-9 P.M., at St. Anthony's School cafeteria, Leesburg Pike (Route 7) and Glencarlyn Road (Culmore).

A \$5.00 fee must accompany the registration card (enclosed here) at the time of application; the deposit will be deducted from the total camp fee but is not returnable if the girl does not attend camp.

By June 15, the balance of the camp fee is due at the Girl Scout office, Falls Church.

If space is available, girls may register after April 30 for more than one two-week session. Also after April 30, applications will be accepted from Girl Scouts outside the Council.

Reimbursement will be made only for cancellations received before the designated session starts, upon receipt of a physician's statement certifying illness.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION:

At the time of registration, a card for physical examination will be given to each applicant. This card must be completed by a legally qualified physician one week before the girl enters camp.

Each camper must present this completed card before being admitted to Coles Trip.

Throughout the season, a Stafford physician will be on call; all campers are covered by health and accident insurance.

TRANSPORTATION:

Parents are invited to visit the camp only on the opening day of each session; campers should arrive with parents between 3 and 4 o'clock on these Sundays.

Girls will be transported from the camp to the Girl Scout office in Falls Church by chartered bus on the closing day of each session.

Should there be campers who are registered for two consecutive sessions, these will return home during the intervening weekend.

CHURCH:

Arrangements may be made for each camper to attend services of her own faith. Transportation is provided to and from church.

The religious affiliations of all campers are considered in the planning of meals and activities.

FEE:

The fee for the eight day session is \$4.00. This covers milk, craft materials, cookouts, insurance, and other expenses. An additional fee of \$4.25 will be charged for those desiring bus transportation to and from Camp Crowell, and must be included with the registration.

TRANSPORTATION:

Transportation will be by private car to all the day camps except Camp Crowell and Quantico which will have special bus service available. For schedule, contact troop leaders.

WEATHER:

Day Camps will be held rain or shine.

WHAT TO WEAR

Camp clothes and sturdy shoes. Sweater, raincoat and boots when necessary.

WHAT TO BRING

Unbreakable drinking cup and nosebag lunch.



TO ANY ADULT INTERESTED IN DAY CAMPING:

One adult volunteer and alternate must register from each troop for every six girls going to day camp. The Council will provide pre-camp training, a nursery for your smaller children and, most important, an opportunity to work with the girls in your neighborhood. You will be notified of training places and dates for your camp. Please fill out the application for the day camp nearest you and send it to your troop leader.

REGISTRATION:

Registration will be accepted for the entire season only, and checks made payable to the Fairfax County Council of Girl Scouts, Inc. must be included. There will be no refunds unless the registration is full. All Scout registrations and Adult Volunteer registrations must be turned into the Troop Leaders. Troop Leaders will turn the registrations into the Registrars (see below) on April 23rd.
