### CAMP STAFF

Camp Director—Miss Adelaide Werner, Regional Director, Region Three.

There will be qualified persons in charge of each part of the camp program. A Red Cross Life Saver will teach swimming.

### LOCATION AND EQUIPMENT

Pine Grove Camp is ideally situated in the Southern Range of the Blue Ridge Mountains, about 35 miles from Harrisburg and 15 miles from Gettysburg. It can be reached by good motor roads, and by the Hunter's Run Branch of the Reading Railroad from Harrisburg. The tents are pitched in a fine old grove of pine trees, in a Pennsylvania State Forest Reservation, through which runs a little mountain brook. An abandoned ore hole offers splendid opportunity for swimming. The water for camp comes from a pure mountain spring approved by the State.

The Leaders and Girl Scouts sleep in tents on canvass army cots. There is a lodge for activities in case of rainy weather.

### CAMP LIFE

The camp will be divided into four troops, one for leaders and three for girls. Girls of the same age will be in the same troop. Each troop will have an experienced captain and several lieutenants. Those girls in the oldest troop (15 to 18 years old) who have had acceptable previous camping experience will be given an opportunity for special work which will help train for future assistant counselorships.

### LEADERS

How to plan and conduct troop meetings with girls in all stages of scout work is the question most frequently asked by the leaders in this region. Every morning a two hour troop meeting will be held during which time a Troop Management Course arranged to meet this need will be given. Those in the troop will do Tenderfoot, Second or First Class work according to their previous training and experience.

### GIRL SCOUTS

Swimming, campcraft, nature, mapping, and first aide for outdoor accidents will be part of the girls' morning program. Each girl will be able to choose two of these activities.

In the afternoon leaders and girls will have time for handicrafts, dramatics, archery, ramb-ling, reading, letter-writing, sketching and swim-ming.

### WHO MAY COME TO CAMP

Any person eighteen years old or over is eligible for the Leaders' Training.

Only registered Girl Scouts will be admitted to the girls' troops.

### COST

Leaders' training covering board and tuition—\$30.00 for the two weeks of which \$2.00 is payable in advance with registration application.

Girls—\$18.00 for two weeks of which \$2.00 is payable in advance with registration application.

No money will be refunded.

A canteen will be held in camp at which Girl Scout equipment and supplies will be sold.

### HEALTH CERTIFICATE

Upon registration each camper will be sent a health questionnaire which must be filled out within one week before coming to camp. No camper will be admitted without her certificate of health.

### TRANSPORTATION

Bus for camp will leave the Harrisburg Pennsylvania R. R. station at 1:00 o'clock on Monday, June 17th. Round trip fare will be \$2.50.

### CHURCH

There is a Catholic Church at Carlisle and arrangements can be made for any one wishing to attend. There is a Protestant church ten minute's walk from camp.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

No food or candy may be sent or brought to the camp.

### VISITORS DAY

Parents and friends of Girl Scouts will be welcome on Sunday. Visitors will not be ad-mitted on any other day.

### CAMP UNIFORM

Middy and bloomer suit No. R101—color green-price \$3.10 advertised in Girl Scout Equipment Magazine is the official camp uniform. Persons buying new camp outfits are urged to buy this uniform. It will be for sale at the camp canteen.
